Malicious: intended to harm or upset other people.

Sabotage: deliberately destroy, damage, or obstruct (something), especially for political or military advantage.

Propaganda: information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote a political cause or point of view.

Concourse: a large space or room in a public building such as a station or airport that people meet in or pass through.

Drastic: (especially of actions) severe and sudden or having very noticeable effects.

Explosive: a substance that can be made to explode, especially any of those used in bombs or shells.

Swabs: a specimen taken with a swab.
