Vocabulary

Servitude: the state of being under the control of someone else and of having no freedom.

Coercion: the use of force to persuade someone to do something that they are unwilling to do.

Marginalized: to treat someone or something as if they are not important.

Vulnerable: able to be easily physically, emotionally, or mentally hurt, influenced, or attacked.

Reprisals: activity against another person, especially as punishment by military forces or a political group.

Hostage: someone who is taken as a prisoner by an enemy in order to force the other people involved to do what the enemy wants.

Submissive: allowing yourself to be controlled by other people or animals.

Introduction

When people are harbored or transported into a situation where they are exploited by violence, deception, **coercion** or are forced to work against their will, it is called Human trafficking.

People in these circumstances undergo different forms of exploitation: forced prostitution, forced labor, forced begging, forced criminality, domestic **servitude**, forced marriage, and forced organ removal.
